This is a project planned as part of master facilities planning as the current turf is due for replacement. The college administration is planning to bring this project forward to the board as part of lease purchase financing that includes the new STEM building. Dr. Ruda,

Mammoth Sports Construction ("Mammoth") is excited about partnering with Garden City Community College on the replacement of the synthetic turf and track respray. It is our understanding that the intention is to contract Mammoth for the scope of work to plan, design and build the above-mentioned project.

This letter is an expression of our mutual intention only and does not constitute a binding agreement among the parties with respect to the project. Any such binding agreement would only arise as a result of the negotiation, execution, and delivery of a final written contract having terms and conditions satisfactory to the parties to such an agreement. This letter of intent is not an agreement to enter a final written contract.

However, in recognition of the time and effort that will be expended by Mammoth regarding the design and planning of this project and to move this project into the queue, the parties agree the following provisions will constitute a legally binding and enforceable agreement governing the pursuit of a final written contract:

- 1. Exclusive Negotiations. Until the final written contract execution or the termination of this Letter of Intent, Garden City Community College officers, directors or other agents of the College will not, directly or indirectly, solicit or accept from any person or entity any offer or expression of interest in, or with respect to the project.
- 2. Intellectual Property. Each party will retain exclusive interest in, and ownership of its Intellectual Property existing prior to this Letter of Intent or developed outside the scope of this Letter of Intent. The intellectual property shared between Mammoth and Garden City Community College under this Letter of Intent are to be kept confidential. The parties agree that in the event this Letter of Intent is terminated prior to the execution of a final written contract, no party may use the intellectual property of the other in pursuit or development of plans for the potential project with any other party or entity.
- 3. Negotiations. Mammoth and Garden City Community College shall work and negotiate in good faith to arrive at a mutually acceptable final written contract at the earliest reasonably practical date allowed by the Board of Trustees.

#### **Travis Bachman Stocking Drive**

Department of Public Safety and Phi Theta Kappa stuffed 77 stockings to support the annual Travis Bachman Stocking Drive. #### Garden City Career Connection Academy

Cary Conley, the new Director of the Career Connection Academy, has spent his first months working diligently to re-structure the staffing of the Academy, increasing the number of full-time positions. Using the same funding, the Academy will now be staffed by three full-time instructors and a full-time data clerk. The hope is these full-time individuals will be able to better and more-flexibly serve the needs of students, particularly as they move into credit-bearing technical and non-technical courses and programs with the college.

We had a 99% return rate on Winter Break Surveys for Check Outs in Residential Life

Our staff has interviewed over ten new applicants for Spring Residential Life Assistants / Hired 6 New Spring RA's/ 4 of which will be graduating in the SPR of 23

Zac will have 2nd Semester Res Life Scenario Training for the new incoming staff starting on January 6th

Annette has been working with the students for both Thanksgiving and X-mas Student Activities within the portico for mental health and wellness.

Common Rooms on both 2nd Floor and 3rd Floor west hall have been fully prepped / with 2nd Floor already back open for Res Life Students / Hopeful to Have 3rd Floor fully functional the start of this next semester.

#### ADMISSIONS

As of December 7<sup>th</sup> 73 NEW students to GCCC have been enrolled.

Currently in the enrollment funnel we have 231 students; 45 inquiries, 110 started/submitted apps, 76 admitted ready for enrollment

Personalized postcards will be going out December 8<sup>th</sup> to students in the various stages of the funnel.

Admissions department made 110 phone calls to students by 12/3/21

Admissions will be visiting with the Counselors Council in Sublette on 12/9 and GCCC is providing lunch for the counselors.

#### CAMP

CAMP has been busy this time of the year promoting the scholarship program among Migrant Education Programs in the area.

Next Spring Semester 2022 – CAMP will have 24 students participating in the program, including two early graduates from GCHS. Each student might receive \$1,500, totaling \$36,000 in scholarships to freshman students at GCCC.

Several applications from seniors at area high schools are being reviewed for the scholarship program next year. Half a dozen interviews have been conducted, and three students have been accepted to next year's CAMP students.

CAMP also met with VP of Instruction Mark Malone regarding the Non-Academic Program Report. The report provides information and statistics of the program during the last 5-yr.

Work on this report continues and is expected to be done next Spring.

#### GCCC TRIO

GCCC TRIO Student Support Services held its December Graduate Reception last Thursday, December 2, where we honored ten graduating sophomores. We are making plans for a scholarship workshop to be held on Tuesday, January 5. In the past, this event has included presentations by sponsors for Bridges to the Future, Kansas LSAMP, NOYCE, KANCO, and the O'Brate Scholarship program as well as GCCC institutional scholarship opportunities.
