**TRANSFER AND ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
FORT HAYS STATE UNIVERSITY
AND
GARDEN CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE
FOR THE
BACHELOR OF TECHNOLOGY LEADERSHIP**

This Transfer and Articulation Agreement is established by and between Garden City Community College (GCCC), Garden City, KS, and Fort Hays State University (FHSU).

The parties agree to the following:

1. The Bachelor of Technology Leadership (BTL) program is designed as an interdisciplinary baccalaureate degree program with emphasis on Technology Leadership. The program is built to serve students who have completed an applicable Associate of Applied Science degree program from an accredited institution recognized by FHSU.
2. Matriculation, transfer, and degree requirements for the BTL program are established by FHSU. The program has been approved by the Kansas Board of Regents. Attachment A reflects basic BTL program requirements. This program may be modified by FHSU from time to time. If and when changes occur with the curriculum requirements, each party will be responsible for informing the other party of these details in a timely manner.
 - a. Students entering the BTL program must graduate from an accredited community, technical, or vocational college with an Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degree.
 - b. Students must meet the 24 credit hour general education requirements, as defined in the BTL program, in their AAS degree program of study. If the AAS degree does not require 24 hours, then additional General Education hours will be added to the FHSU BTL Program.
 - c. Students with AAS degrees who have not met the General Education requirements of this Agreement will have those hours added to the BS degree.
 - d. Transfer students are subject to the same FHSU assessment policies and procedures as all other students of FHSU.
 - e. Students must complete a minimum of 60 hours from a 4-year college with a minimum of 30 hours from FHSU.
 - f. Students must complete a total of 45 hours of upper-level (junior, senior) hours.
 - g. A total of 55 hours of general education is required.
